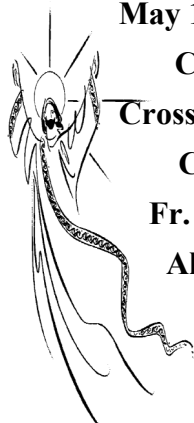

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT —

This is an attempt to update you regarding the tuition and enrollment process at Notre Dame High School. It is a constant effort to make the enrollment process for Notre Dame Students more efficient. As you know, we have moved toward tuition management through the FACTS program.

Families who wish to pay their child's tuition in full prior to July 1, 2018 can mail or deliver the payment to the ND Business Office. Please note that the payment must be received no later than June 30<sup>th</sup> should you choose this option.

FACTS Tuition Management requires **every** ND Family to create and maintain an account which reflects ND charges and payments throughout the year. Parents or guardians use the FACTS account to select a tuition payment schedule and confirm preferred method of invoicing. Please be aware that even if you have made a one-time payment in full, a FACTS account is required.

### Payment options include:

- A one-time payment in full accepted at ND Business Office before June 30<sup>th</sup> or through FACTS on July 1<sup>st</sup>
- Two payments of half of your student's tuition due July 1<sup>st</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup>
- A 10 month option beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>.

### The enrollment process includes

- Submission of a registration or re-registration form & fee
- Confirmed tuition payment plan
- Selection of Parent Volunteer Commitment
- Signing of the Code of Conduct.

A student will not receive a school schedule unless all aspects of the enrollment process have been completed.

We appreciate your involvement in your child's education and are here to help! If you have questions regarding any aspect of the enrollment process, please call the Business Office.

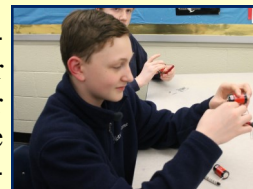


## 7th & 8th GRADE NEWS ~

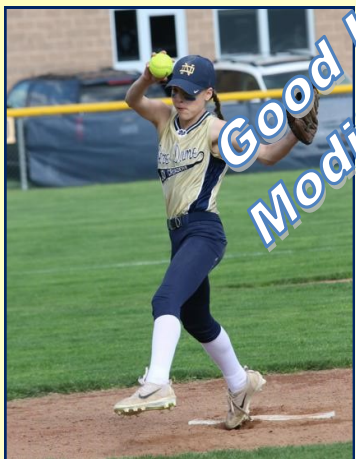

## FROM THE GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT—

The year is quickly coming to an end and soon graduation and all things related will be here. The Guidance Office is still asking that any scholarship or grant award letters be brought in so that this information can become part of the graduation program. We want to include any recognition each student has received, even if it is not from their destination college.



### Graduation Announcements and Tickets



Guidance will be meeting with the Seniors in the near future to give them a packet of announcements for their graduation. These packets have ten announcements for each student but there are more available should families need more than just ten to send to friends and relatives. These announcements **are not invitations** to graduation and they do not have the individual student's name on them. Seniors should have name cards printed or include a senior picture when they send out announcements. If families would like to order name cards, we recommend Herff-Jones, and you can visit their website to order: [www.herffjones.com](http://www.herffjones.com).

**Graduation Seating will be handled differently this year.** Seniors will be given two parent tickets for graduation. In the event that they have step parents, they should notify the Guidance Office for additional tickets in the reserved parent seating section. The tickets for the parent section are seat specific and students will be given parent tickets after a lottery drawing. In addition to the parent tickets, students need to get General Admission tickets for any additional guest. Anyone attending the NDHS graduation needs a ticket for admission, but seating will not be assigned other than the parent seating. Therefore, it would be important to 1) get the number of tickets needed and 2) arrive in a timely fashion to secure your seat. General admission tickets are not seat specific.

### Scheduling

Counselors have been meeting with students to solidify course selections for the 2018-19 school year. Parents, please be on the lookout for a form to sign confirming your students choices of courses. **A schedule will not be created for a student who has not been re-enrolled for the 18-19 school year.** Please note that these are course *requests*, and while we always give our best effort to make everything work, unfortunately, we can never make a guarantee that every request will “fit” into a student's schedule. Once schedules are finalized, an email will be sent to families indicating that they are available for access on SchoolTool.

### Junior Information

At this point, Juniors should be well into the college search process. Fall will creep up quickly and it will be time for college applications to be completed before we know it. As a general rule of thumb, students apply to 5-8 colleges or universities. Some apply to fewer, some apply to more. However, it's strongly suggested that you narrow your list to a manageable number. Be sure to include a variety of schools: from open admissions to highly selected schools. Don't forget to plan for those college campus visits!

### Mercy Learning Online

There are a variety of Mercy Learning Online courses available over the summer that students can currently enroll in. Registration is open and students are encouraged to see Mrs. Barron as soon as possible to sign up for these courses. Mercy Learning Online courses run from **June 18-July 20, 2018**, and cost \$275 per course. Any student interested in taking an online course must turn in a registration form and check by May 1st.

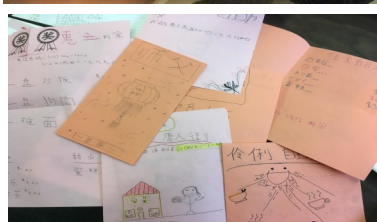

## Beijing Garden Chinese Restaurant Field Trip

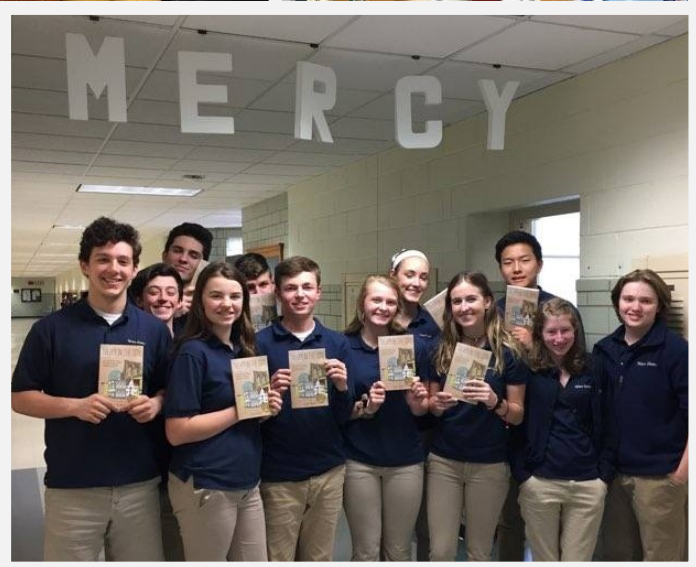
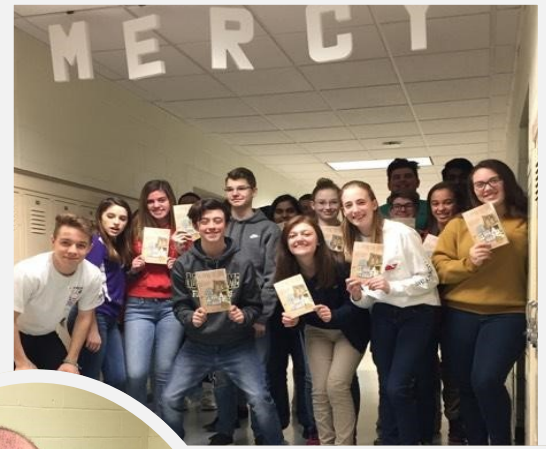

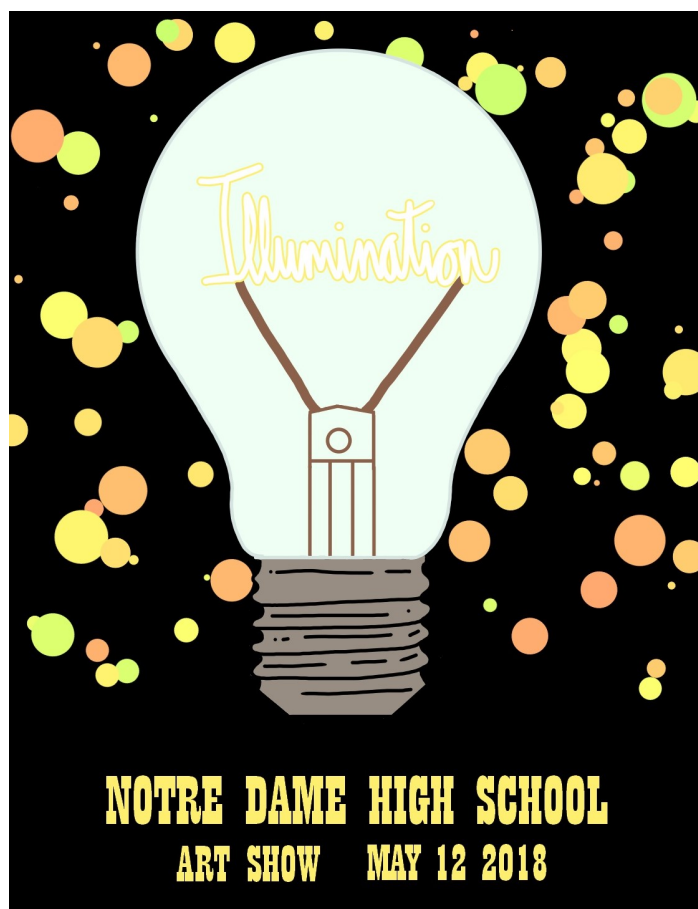
